Governors Evaluation of school year 2019 - 2020

Due to unprecedented times, on the 20th March 2020, school had to close its doors to all pupils apart from those of key workers or those considered to be vulnerable. This has impacted on schools nationwide. Gorse Hill Primary School ensured that pupils entitled to free school meals were provided with a voucher each week as part of the national scheme. Staff worked tirelessly to ensure that children received good home learning opportunities across the curriculum resulting in being only one of two Trafford schools awarded the 'Virtual School Games Award' for PE. Staff also maintained communication with all of our families ensuring that any issues were dealt with or passed on to the relevant support agency. In June 2020, school prepared for wider opening and carried out risk assessments in consultation with all stake holders. Not only were we able to open to the target year groups, vulnerable and key worker families, we were also able to offer some transition days to our Y5. Despite all of this, over the academic year we continued the journey of school improvement with the hard work, dedication and commitment of the Headteacher, staff and governors, and the support of parents. We have been able to achieve further success for our children and develop the opportunities offered ensuring that the children receive the best possible education in a stimulating, supporting, safe and caring environment.
